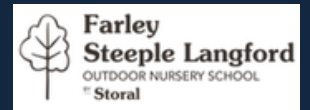
Today, Anthony Pagett, the Director of Curriculum at Barton Peveril, came in to talk to our Year 11 students all about their incredible college.
