LABOUR MARKET INFORMATION FACT

UCAS data shows 316,850 UK 18-yearolds have applied to university this year – an increase of 0.7% from 2023 and the second highest on record.

This puts the application rate for UK 18-year-olds at 41.3%, down from 41.5% in 2023, but up from 38.2% in 2019. <u>Source</u>
