We know it's the first week back and February feels AGES away... however, we want to bring your attention to the fact that 10th-14th February is National Apprenticeship Week. This is one of the biggest events in the careers calendar.

We will share more information with you about specific events the week before the event. But, for now, these are some of the things you can do if you're keen to learn more about apprenticeships and make NAW2025 a really impactful event for your career knowledge, growth and future planning.



Here are the events that are already listed for the week, you can register to as many as you'd like. Some are broad and about apprenticeships in general whereas others are specific to certain industries/employers.

If you already know that you want to follow the university route, you can find lots of events using <u>UniTasterDays</u>.

The Met Office work experience programme consists of two distinct phases. The first is an online work experience. This standalone programme is available to all UK-based students aged between 13 and 18, and all who register are guaranteed a place. As part of this programme, you'll explore typical roles in the Met Office through a series of videos, projects and webinars. Following completion of the online programme, you can apply for a second phase of work experience - a two to three day in-person placement, for which limited places are available.

On Wednesday 22nd January, all of our Year 10 students will be attending this year's Appren-T-Fest that takes place at Salisbury 6th Form College and Wilshire College and University Centre.

Students will visit 2 employer exhibitions featuring multiple local employers where they will be able to discover all of the apprenticeships that are available.
